Job Purpose	Managing the EU-funded project “Climate cHange and the future of coAstal CommuNities: transformation of soCiality, livElihoods and lifeStYle in the South Pacific (CHANCES-Pacific)
Position Background	<p>The Vanuatu National University (NUV) was established by Act No. 34 of 2019, with a mandate to "ensure the advancement of higher education and lifelong learning through academic and professional excellence through training, teaching and learning, in English and French, official languages, research and international cooperation".</p> <p>NUV is developing its research activity and strengthening its regional collaboration, as part of PIURN (Pacific Islands Universities Regional Network). The EU-funded CHANCES project falls under Call 3 “Living Labs for Innovative Solutions to address Climate Change Impact in the Pacific” of the RERIPA (Strengthening Research and Innovation Ecosystems to address the Impact of Climate Change in the Pacific) project.</p> <p>RERIPA is funded by the European Union and is a project collaboratively implemented by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- IRD – Research Institute for Development- PIDF – Pacific Islands Development Forum- Meteorological and Geo-Hazard Department Vanuatu- PIANGO – Pacific Islands Association of Non-Governmental Organizations <p>The objectives of the call 3 of RERIPA is to create Living Labs (LLs), i.e. multi-disciplinary regional public/private consortia able to address the Impact of Climate Change (CCI) in the Pacific Small Islands Developing States (SIDS), through innovative and sustainable user-centred solutions founded on research-based evidence, with a focus on coastal vulnerability, lagoon and ocean health, and sea level rise.</p> <p>NUV is part of the strong consortium composed of the University of the South Pacific (USP), Ministry of Education and Training, Government of Vanuatu (MOET), the Solomon Islands National University (SINU), the Institute Agronomique Néo-Calédonien (IAC), the University of New Caledonia (UNC),</p>

the University of Sydney, and the EU funded project Family farming, lifestyle, and health in the South Pacific (FALAH).

The main objectives of the CHANCES-Pacific project are to understand the future of livelihoods and lifestyles of the communities in the Pacific affected by coastal vulnerabilities and sea-level rise with the help of digital technologies (Apps and digital medias) and to identify solutions with and for communities involved in living labs that can improve livelihood and lifestyle, in Vanuatu, Solomon Islands and Fiji.

Position Summary

NUV is looking to recruit a competent and highly motivated person for a position of project management.

The CHANCES Project has two objectives:

- Understand the future of livelihoods and lifestyles of the communities in the Pacific affected by coastal vulnerabilities and sea-level rise with the help of digital technologies (Apps and digital medias).
- Identify solutions with and for communities involved in living lab build that can improve livelihood and lifestyle

The CHANCES Project address also Climate Change Impacts by:

- Working with communities from Vanuatu, Fiji and Solomon Islands that are subject to sea level rise and coastal erosion
- Understanding the impacts of salinization of soil, flooding, loss of lands on crops production and the livelihoods of coastal households and communities
- Setting up Living Labs in urban and rural areas to understand the changes in livelihood practices and lifestyles, focusing on the transition in food production and accessibility in the context of climate change impacts on vulnerable territories subject to coastal vulnerability and sea level rise.

The effective Project Manager responsibilities and accountability requires that he or she gain the confidence of the project partners through fair, open and responsive leadership. The Project Manager is responsible for the effective overall management of the project, ensuring the efficient implementation of the project and the good coordination between partners and collaborators. The Project Manager will be responsible for the implementation of the project, the management of the budget for the project, with the Project Coordinator (lead applicant @ USP).

The Project Manager is responsible for the effective functioning of the project.

The Project Manager is responsible for liaising with the different partners of the project, the lead applicant and the NUV Deputy-Vice-Chancellor's office, in order to provide fortnightly updates on the CHANCES project.

The successful candidate will oversee the development of the CHANCES Project. Ideal candidates will have extensive experience in managing and conducting research projects in the South Pacific region.

Other responsibilities include the development of activities related to the CHANCES project.

The ability to work across disciplines and institutional boundaries and collaborate with government agencies, as well as NGOs and private sector partners in Vanuatu and the Pacific region, is fundamental to this position. Effective communication with a variety of stakeholders, including the general public, is essential and in line with the strategy of the National University of Vanuatu.

Key Responsibilities – Detailed Listing

The Project Manager will play a key role in the efficient and successful management of the project, based at the National University of Vanuatu.

Key responsibilities:

- Ensuring the proper management of the project: implementation of the activities (organizing workshops, online meetings, monitoring and evaluating activities in living labs and outcomes) in line with the budget to support deliverables and expected results., contributing to the overall objectives and outcomes of RERIPA;
- Preparing project work plans;
- Coordinating and conducting research activities - particularly coordinating the work plans between all staff and partners of the project, supporting their activities and sending them regular updates on the deliverables and results
- Implement the activities identified in the project: training sessions, qualitative interview, data collection through digital tool, analysis of the data, development of a dissemination strategy if the results, ensuring the sustainability of the projects
- Reporting to the project coordinator of CHANCES (The University of the South Pacific Professor Sushil Kumar, Director Research)
- Supervising the work of the Research Assistants and the interns hired for the project
- Addressing challenges within the project by applying appropriate corrective measures; and
- Performing any activity needed to ensure the smooth operation of their project.
